Designer Hella Jongerius drew her inspiration for the Key Ring motif from the Eames Elephant, which was created as playful decorative object by Charles and Ray Eames in the 1940s. The Key Rings are made of high-quality leather: to make sustainable use of leather left over from the production of upholstered furniture, Vitra uses it to craft small objects – such as the leather elephant Key Rings. They are soft to the touch and come in the six colours of leather most frequently used in production.

- **Material:** high-quality furniture leather (leather remnants from the production of Vitra furniture).

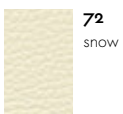

The standard grade leather used by Vitra is a robust cowhide leather, dyed-through, pigmented and embossed with an even grain pattern. Since it is hard-wearing and easy to maintain, it can also be used in office environments.

Leather is available in 16 colours.

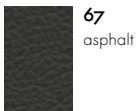

Fastness to rubbing	Grade 4 dry and wet



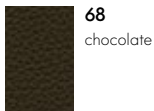

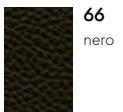

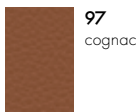
